## **SWO Timeline**

#### **Applications Open**

Applications open in mid-December

#### **Students Apply**

Students submit an application with two examples of their written work. Applications are reviewed approximately every two weeks and are accepted on a rolling basis.

#### **Notification (~biweekly)**

After regularly reviewing the applications (about every two weeks), we will notify students of their selection status; accepted, alternate. or not selected.

#### **Commit to Program**

After being accepted, students must complete their enrollment forms, including payment or financial aid application, in order to be enrolled in the program.

#### **Final Preparations**

Students pay remaining program costs and prepare for their virtual experience

#### **Program Begins**

Instructors will introduce students to the daily format and establish a strong community of writers that will learn from and inspire one another.

#### **SWO**

Students attend virtual classes, learn from instructors and guest speakers, generate new work, and workshop one another's writing. There are lots of opportunities to interact, share and be inspired.

#### **Program Ends**

Students end with the opportunity to showcase their progress and celebrate with their community of writing peers.

# **Central Time**
